What is a quaich—the Scottish cup of friendship?


Theresa May will be the first foreign leader to visit Donald Trump since his inauguration on January 20. On the visit, she is expected to give Melania Trump, the First Lady, a hamper full of produce from Chequers – including apple juice, damson jam and marmalade – and to Donald Trump, the President, she will give an engraved quaich.



What is a quaich? The quaich, pronounced "quake", is an ancient Scottish artefact, whose form has not changed for centuries. The term 'auaich' emerged in the mid-16th century, from the Scottish Gaelic word 'cuach', meaning cup. Originating in the Highlands, where clan chiefs prized them as a token of hospitality, they have been used across Scotland for centuries as a cup of friendship. The English and US colonial versions were called porringers, while in northern Sweden, they were known as kuksa.

When is a quaich given? Today it is rarely used as a drinking vessel, but rather it is a symbol of welcome and kinship. Its two handles signify trust, both on the part of the giver and the receiver. Tracing its origins to the distant past of Highland chivalry, the quaich is a timeless reminder of the enduring Scottish values of friendship and hospitality. Fishermen also use them to toast the opening of the new salmon season every year by tipping whisky from the quaich into the river.

The gift of a quaich is an appropriate one, given Donald Trump's strong connections to Scotland. The President is half-Scottish on his mother's side and he owns two Scottish golf courses, at Menie and Trump Turnberry. Discussions are also underway about the president playing a round of golf on the private nine-hole course at Balmoral Castle during his first official state visit to the UK this summer.




Who else has received a quaich?

Nelson Mandela drank whisky from a quaich after he was awarded "Freedom of the City" of Edinburgh in 1997.

The honor was bestowed upon the former South African leader in tribute to how he inspired others.

The Waterloo Tree quaich was one of many historic relics collected by Sir Walter Scott. The piece was made from silver gilt and elm wood, cut from a tree at the Waterloo battlefield. The Duke of Wellington is said to have given orders to his soldiers from under the tree. Scott's quaich dates from 1824 and was made by Joseph Angell of London. It is engraved with Scott's motto, "Watch Well".



Winners at the 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games were presented – along with their gold, silver or bronze medals – with special commemorative quaiches made from elm wood, designed by Glasgow-based artist Paul Hodgkiss. At the inaugural Commonwealth Youth Games in 2000, a silver quaich was made to mark the occasion. It is now passed over at the end of each Games from one host nation to the next.
