Mackay or MacKay ?

Recently I was asked, what is the official spelling of Clan Mackay? I know that we have seen the name as Mackay and MacKay, but which spelling correct. So, I asked Michelle Sandelier to respond to the question.

While there are families that spell their surname both ways, the official Clan name is the one of the Clan Chief and he historically spelled his name "Mackay", according to the Lord Lion, King of Arms. Any other spellings are secondary.

So, when we are spelling Mackay as related to Clan business or tent banners, forms, etc., we should use Mackay, even though you may spell your personal name MacKay or other related spellings. Thanks Michelle for answering this question.

Take a trip to the edge... Cape Wrath



Cape Wrath is the iconic cornerstone where the north and west coasts of Scotland meet. It is the furthest North West point of the British mainland – a dramatic headland with its whitewashed lighthouse perched atop the cliffs. There are stunning & spectacular views with dramatic coastlines, the expansive Atlantic Ocean and a vast moorland wilderness all in one place. There is no land mass between here and the Arctic. Orkney can be seen to the north east and the Western Isles viewed to the south west.

Cape Wrath is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, SSSI as well as a Special Protection Area for birds. In addition to this, there are much coveted geological features; it is steeped in heritage and of worldwide maritime significance.

Access to Cape Wrath is challenging for many reasons including its remote location. There is only one road and it is separated from the main road network by the Kyle of Durness. There is no transportation method for public vehicles to reach it. The only way to access the road



without hiking over moorland is by the Cape Wrath Ferry, a foot passenger boat from Keoldale a mile south of Durness (make sure you arrange a return time as there's no other way back).

Once off the boat the way is obvious – there is only one road which continues for 11 miles to the lighthouse. The road is tarmac but fairly broken in places so the surface can be quite rough. After a short section parallel to the Kyle of Durness which gives wonderful views across to Balnakiel Bay the road swings inland and climbs onto open moorland which is crossed via numerous ups and downs all the way to Cape Wrath.

If you can't imagine yourself walking the 11 miles you can take the Cape Wrath Minibus, the only vehicular option available to the public. It is a 3 hour trip with a driver that offers informative commentary so you can learn about the area, past and present.



After about 8 miles a detour of a mile (each way) can be made down to the idyllic bay at Kearvaig, guarded by a spectacular sea stack and lying just to the west of the highest cliffs on the UK mainland. The track to the bay is quite rough so be prepared.

Once at the lighthouse there are good coastal views and plenty of seabirds including Puffins in the spring and summer months. The lighthouse also offers refreshments throughout the year.

So if you're heading to Mackay country, don't miss out... take a trip to the edge!
